I keep straining my ears to hear a sound.


Maybe someone is digging underground,

- 1. Did the action take place in the afternoon? No, it was at 9:15 am
- 2. What was the weather the days before? It has been raining for several days. Soil was soaked.
- 3. Is the topic about a gold mine? No. A coal mine.
- 4. The name of the village is Aberfan. Where is it located? In Wales (remember that UK is made with England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland)
- 5. How many children between died? 116 How many adults? 28
- 6. The tragedy took place the 20th of October. What was the year? **1966**
- 7. Can you tell David Davis' story? He was a schoolboy and buried during the catastrophe. Searchers thought he was dead and put a sheet on his face. But one people saw his foot moving and he was reexamined!
- **8.** Evan Price was one of the first person to arrive. Why did she suffer PTSD (*Post-traumatic Syndrome Disease*)? **She was a police officer but she discovered at first her dead son!**
