“The Chancellor of the University of Ulster is the renowned actor, Dr James Nesbitt. As the formal head of the University, Dr Nesbitt was installed as our fifth Chancellor at his installation ceremony in the Riverside Theatre, Coleraine on 8 June 2010.

Dr James Nesbitt was selected as Chancellor in part for his ability to be an ambassador for the University and his abilities in promoting our activities and interests within Northern Ireland and beyond.

Key to this appointment was his clear empathy with values of the University, his ability to influence widely, his identification with our students and an appreciation of the Chancellor’s role in the development of the University.

In 2003 he received the honorary degree of Doctor of Letters (D Litt) from the University in recognition for Services to Drama.

His movie roles have included Ralph Fiennes’ adaptation of Shakespeare’s *Coriolanus* where he starred opposite Vanessa Redgrave, Gerard Butler and Brian Cox and also in Emilio Estevez’s drama *The Way*, where he starred alongside Martin Sheen.

More recently, he has wrapped up roles starring as Bofur the dwarf in Peter Jackson’s *The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey*, the first of a trilogy of films and he’s also back on TV in the medical drama, *Monroe*. “
